## Fiscal Year in Review (July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019)

Ravenwood Health hosted our 3rd Run with Ravenwood 5K around Chardon. Over 80 participants joined us that chilly morning, raising more than \$10,000, supporting clients receiving mental health and addiction services.

Our Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) program continues to grow, demonstrating excellent outcomes for those experiencing opioid addiction. We acquired a MAT program in Chesterland, and with that, we're able to serve about 100 clients at any given time. Clinicians work closely with Genoa Pharmacy in expanded partnership, integrating more clinical care, and providing a safe environment for team members and clients.

The first annual Anthony Donofrio Memorial Golf Outing raised over \$12,500 in support of our addiction and recovery programs. Early morning rain ended, and the sunshine welcomed nearly 100 golfers together in advocacy for those needing our help.

The Geauga County Crisis Response Team (CRT), developed in 2018, has responded to six different school-related crises, and the needs of two local companies. The CRT acts as a source of education and resources with partner agencies. We help victims and families through an emergency and the community through difficult times.

The need for mental health services in schools continues to increase. We have been working with the Educational Service Center of the Western Reserve to provide programming that best fits the needs of the students.

Our Intensive Home-Based Treatment (IHBT) program for children and their families has exploded with participants. This evidence-based program has proven extremely effective at keeping children out of group homes, residential, and hospital placements.

We could not have done this without the help and support of our community partners. Thank you for another excellent year.
